## 1 INTRODUCTION

If you are new in your walk with God, this lesson is going to be important for you. This booklet will help you establish a solid understanding which will help set your spiritual foundation. If you have been a believer for a long time, these truths are important and vital to successful Christian living and they bear repeating over and over again. In fact, in our church you will often hear the importance of preaching the gospel to yourself daily. These truths are vitally important to keep close to our hearts. Let's start here...

## 2 WHO IS GOD?

We need to start with a clear understanding of who God is and what God deserves.

### A. GOD IS THE CREATOR OF ALL

READ Genesis 1.

It is clear from the Bible that God created everything, and He did it in 7 days! What an amazing and powerful God we serve!

Have you ever looked up into the sky on a clear night? It's mind-blowing to think about how many stars are in the universe!

In an article from CNN.com, we read the following, incredible discovery:

*"Ever wanted to wish upon a star? Well, you have 70,000 million million million to choose from. That's the total number of stars in the known universe, according to a study by Australian astronomers. It's also about 10 times as many stars as grains of sand on all the world's beaches and deserts."*

READ Psalm 147:4.

Not only did God create the universe, He also holds it all together!


Colossians 1:16-17 says,

*"For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities--all things were created through him and for him. And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together."*

Along with the universe, God also created each of us. David praised God in Psalm 139:13-16 with these words:


*"For you formed my inward parts; you knitted me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well. My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them."*

God created the universe and formed each of us in our mother's womb. God made you. This is wonderful news because it gives each of us purpose for living! We were created by a powerful, all-knowing God and He has a purpose for our lives.

READ Isaiah 43:7.

- ① So, then, what is the meaning of life?

Understanding God's power and His purpose is an essential part of our salvation. Our salvation starts with a loving God Who created you to bring glory to Him.

### ③ WHO ARE WE?

There is one big problem that keeps us from fulfilling this purpose.

In the very first book of the Bible, Genesis, God created a perfect garden. He also created man to enjoy the garden and be in perfect fellowship with Him. He had only one rule.

READ Genesis 2:15-17.

- ① What was God's rule?

- ① In Genesis 3:6 what did man do?

READ Genesis 3:8-9.

- ① Why do you think Adam is hiding?

- ① What has sin done to God's relationship with man?

It wasn't just Adam who sinned. In fact, the Bible teaches us an important truth in Romans 3:23.

READ Romans 3:23.

What does that verse teach us?

Do you believe that's true for you?

Think for a moment about the Ten Commandments. How many can you list?

Even if you can't list them all, go back over the list.

Put a check mark by the ones you have disobeyed.

The truth is we are all sinners and that sin keeps us from enjoying a relationship with a holy God.

READ Isaiah 6:1-5.

What does the text say about God?

What was Isaiah's reaction to God?

🔪 What do we deserve?

God is all-powerful, all-knowing, and He sits on the throne of the universe. He is a holy God who is completely separate from sin. In fact, because God is Holy and just and must punish sin.

Back in Genesis, God punished Adam and Eve for their sin. God is a holy God. He hates sin. He's also a just God. That means that sin must be punished. Just as we want judges to punish criminals in our day, God must also punish sin.

READ Romans 6:23.

🔪 What does this verse tell us?

READ Revelation 21:8. (this verse talks about spiritual death)

🔪 What does the Bible say is the second death?

**LET'S SUMMARIZE:**

1. God created us with an eternal purpose: To bring Him glory.
2. Man sinned and hindered that purpose.
3. Because God is just and holy, He must punish sin. Punishment for sin is a place called Hell, which is spiritual death.

That's pretty bad news so far, but it gets much better! God is holy and just, but God is also loving! He provided His Son, Jesus Christ to die in our place.

## 4 WHAT DID GOD DO?

God was not going to allow our sin to stand in the way of His purpose. And in His love, He provided something amazing for us!

READ the following verses and summarize each passage in your own words.

 John 3:16

 Romans 5:8

 1 Peter 3:18

God gave His Son Jesus to die on the cross. When He did, He paid the price for our sin. All we have to do is to believe or trust in that and we can have eternal life!

Many people, however, want to be good enough to earn God's favor. They believe that if they work hard and do enough good things, that God will overlook their sin.

So if we can't earn it, then what can we do?

READ Romans 10:13.

✎ According to this verse, what do we need to do?

## **5 TRUTHS TO REMEMBER**

As we stated at the beginning of this booklet, we feel it is important to constantly remind ourselves about these truths. It's easy to get into the "rut" of life and rarely give these important truths a thought. However, to maintain spiritual growth and fervency, we need regular reminders of the following:

### **A. WHO GOD IS**

The Creator and Sustainer of the universe. He is HOLY and JUST and must punish sin.

### **B. WHO I AM**

A sinful wretch who has nothing that would commend myself to God. There is simply NO GOOD in me at all. I deserve God's wrath.

### **C. WHAT GOD DID**

He sent His Son to take that wrath for me. Jesus died in my place. For His glory ALONE and by His grace ALONE, Jesus paid the penalty for my sin.

### **D. WHAT I MUST DO**

Turn from my sin and trust that He died for me. I cannot earn His favor even after salvation. His love and goodness for me is based on His grace alone!

Remembering these truths every day will keep us away from many sinful practices. It will keep us humble and help us avoid self-righteousness. It will keep us joyful as we realize how much our God loves us! And it will help us to LOVE Him MORE!
