Baptism

1 BAPTISM

Our Lord commanded His church to make disciples and baptize believers. It is quite clear that the early church understood His teaching and obeyed it. Numerous references tell us of their immediate baptism after their salvation.

Since baptism is our Savior's imperative and was faithfully practiced by the New Testament church, every believer must carefully study and heed Christ's teaching on baptism.

3 WHY SHOULD A BELIEVER BE BAPTIZED?

A. IDENTIFICATION WITH JESUS CHRIST

READ Romans 6:3-16

Baptism is not a ritual, rather, it is an identification with Jesus Christ.

Baptism is an outward expression of your inward faith in Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. It is a reminder that you are dead to sin and have arisen to walk in newness of life.

B. CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

READ Acts 2:36-42

Notice the events which preceded membership to the local church:

1. Conviction
2. Repentance and Faith
3. Baptism
4. Membership

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HOW SHOULD A BELIEVER BE BAPTIZED?

In the New Testament, the Greek word for "baptize" is "baptizein," which means "to dip or immerse."

READ the following passages:

1. John 3:23
2. Acts 8:36-39
3. Romans 6:3-5
4. Colossians 2:12

Circle the mode of baptism that fits the thought of these passages?

sprinkling pouring immersion

Biblical immersion symbolizes our identification with Christ's death, burial, and resurrection (Romans 6:3). It consists of excluding the person from sight (in posture or repose of death) once in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and rising to newness of life.

What would you say to a person who says, "I'm a disciple of Christ, but have no desire to be baptized?"
