INTRODUCTION

The mission of our church is, "To glorify God by making disciples through the power of the gospel." This mission is based on Jesus' great commission to His disciples in Matthew 28:18-20. This passage clearly becomes the guiding passion of God's followers for the rest of the New Testament. The book of Acts describes the history of this mission impact on the known world. The epistles are Paul's practical outworking of that mission in local churches. There is no question that God wants His people to be making disciples of others.

Paul told Timothy in 2 Timothy 2:1-2,

"You then, my child, be strengthened by the grace that is in Christ Jesus, and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also."

God's clear plan for the church is for His people to teach one another God's truths. And yet, few Christians know how to actually accomplish this mission. We know that we need to do be making disciples, but we don't seem to know how to do it.

This Biblical Foundations study is here to help you be intentional in your discipleship of others. These booklets are designed to be a one on one discipleship program that gives you the tools you need to teach key Biblical and foundational lessons. These booklets may also be used to help answer questions that a young believer might have.



HOW IT WORKS

1. THE BOOKLETS

There are a number of booklets in this series that cover key topics such as Salvation, The Bible, Prayer, Personal Outreach and more. These booklets are worksheet style, meaning the disciple works through the lesson, looks up the verses and answers the questions. As they do this, they will be learning what the Bible says about these topics and learning how to apply these truths to their lives.

Each booklet is written by pastors and biblical counselors who have hours of experience discipling people through various life situations.

2. THE FORMAT

Though this can be done in many ways, our suggestion is to give the disciple the booklet to work through on their own. They will bring the completed booklet back to you on an appointed time where you can go over it with them, insuring they understood the material. Once you complete a booklet, you can give them the next one to complete for your next meeting. In most of the booklets, there is a section at the end entitled "Life Change." This section will help your disciple apply these lessons to their life in a real way. There are also book suggestions if the disciple wants to dig deeper into that topic.

Don't forget to be praying for and with your disciple as they are working through these booklets. This is going to be a great time of growth and understanding for them!

3. THE ORDER

These booklets are not numbered to be used in a specific order. We have found different disciples will need the lessons in different orders. In other words, you may have just walked through "The Bible" with a disciple, and due to what's going on in their life, perhaps they have questions about baptism next. You can then assign the Baptism booklet as their next lesson instead of feeling like you need to walk through a specific order. However, some lessons work well in sequence such as "Salvation" before "Baptism," although most lessons can stand on their own.

3. WHERE DO I FIND THE BOOKLETS?

4. WHAT DO THE LESSONS COVER?

For each booklet, there are certain key truths we hope will come to the surface. As you teach them, be sure these key truths are clear. See the chart on the following pages for the key truths highlighted in each booklet.

Lesson	Key Truths
Salvation	 God created us with an eternal purpose: To bring Him glory. Man sinned and hindered that purpose. Because God is just and holy, He must punish sin. Punishment for sin is a place called Hell, which is spiritual death. Because we cannot save ourselves, Jesus became a man, lived a perfect life in my place, then died on the cross for my sin. There must be a time when we call on Him, believing these truths, and asking Him to save us. Ensure your disciple has done this.
Purpose	 We have been created for a purpose and that purpose is to bring God glory. We bring Him glory by showing the world around us how great our God is. God showed His greatness in His Son, through creation, through the church, and in the people He created. This purpose needs to impact my thinking everyday.
Gospel Centrality	 The gospel is the paramount truth for unbelievers, but also believers. In order to understand the Bible, you need to know that the gospel is the central message. I need the gospel in order to grow spiritually. Bible authors demonstrated that truth with both direct connections to the gospel and/or with gospel language. Therefore, the gospel should be the key truth that informs my worldview. As such, it will change the way I think about everything.
The Bible	 Because God has given us His word, it should take authority in our lives. God's word is infallible (without error). God's word is sufficient for all of life's problems. As believers, we should hear, read, and study God's word.
Baptism	 According to Jesus, baptism is an important step for all believers. Baptism is identification with the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The normal mode of baptism in the bible is immersion after salvation.
Prayer	 When we understand Who God is and what He has asked us to do, we will call on God and He will answer us abundantly. Therefore, we should make prayer a regular activity in our lives.

Lesson	Key Truths
Worship	 God places a high value on worship. Worship must be an internal, passionate response (spirit), to the reality of Who God is (truth). Worship is the magnification of God and the minimization of self. It's a lifestyle It should be important to the church.
Growth and Change 1	 It is possible to change Change is hard. Jeremiah 17 gives a good overview of how change happens. In order for behavior to change, the heart must change. Change is only possible through the power of the gospel.
Growth and Change 2	 We need to be aware of our heart condition. There are four key heart patterns we tend to fall into: Anger, foolishness, despair, and fear. We need to discover our key heart patterns and address them with the gospel.
What is the Church?	 There are some common misconceptions about church that we need to be aware of. There is both a universal church involving every believer of all time, and a gathering of people in a specific location (local church.) God ordained two offices for the local church. Pastors (also called Elders and Overseers) and deacons. Pastors equip the saints for the work of the ministry. Deacons serve the church.
How does the church work?	 God sees the church as very important even though our culture does not. God's primary tool for getting the gospel to the world is the church. Our church's mission is "to glorify God my making disciples through the power of the gospel." We believe that the church is the place where people should experience God's glory every Sunday. Jesus gave the church the primary mission of discipleship. Our church has 5 key distinctives: applicational preaching, passionate worship, intentional discipleship, fervent prayer, and strategic outreach.

Lesson	Key Truths
Community	 We were all created to live in community with other believers. Community means living out the "one anothers" of the New Testament. To truly live in community we must deal with conflict biblically. Community in our church happens primarily through small group. All of life's difficulties are discipled through community.
Personal Outreach	 Jesus commanded us to preach the gospel to every creature. Because we have been saved, we are ambassadors of Christ. Prayer must fuel our outreach. There are people all around us ready for the gospel if would would simply lift up our eyes to see them. Preaching the gospel must go hand in hand with helping people in need. Outreach is more than just living a certain way for people to notice. It mandates that we tell people the gospel truths. Learning how to bring a conversation into a gospel invitation will help you.
Dealing with Conflict biblically	 Conflict with others is inevitable. We should seek to honor God through our righteous response to conflict. They should understand the steps to resolving conflict Biblically (Examine Yourself, Confess Your Sin, Gently Restore, and Forgiveness) They should understand what forgiveness is.
